Main duties:

- + Work with industry partners to develop a range of curriculum content suitable for Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 3 students. For example, in areas such as Mixed Reality and Artificial Intelligence.
- + Work with the members of the Digital Schoolhouse team to support and manage the development of careers education resources.
- + Undertake and keep up-to-date with the latest educational research when and where relevant to support continued innovation in the classroom.
- + Create a series of resources aimed at parents, enabling them to support the development of Computational Thinking and creative digital skills with their children.
- + Work alongside the Senior Communications and Events Officer to suggest and manage content for the Digital Schoolhouse website; with particular focus on research, thought leadership and content for parents and teachers.
