Just Dance Tournament

Pre-tournament introduction lesson

The Just Dance tournament is designed to give students an opportunity to experience an esports tournament using Ubisoft's popular Just Dance video game.

















Session Overview

Prior to the pre-tournament lesson, print the worksheet packs one per student.

3	Teacher to introduce esports and read some of the esports industry stats. Teacher should try to talk about the social and economic advantages of the industry. Slide 3 includes statistics from the UK.	DSH- presentation- just-dance- tournament - slides 3
4	Task 1 - Learners should think about who will be joining them in teams for the Just Dance tournament and complete the worksheet. They should agree on a team name for the tournament and design a logo for their team. It is suggested the teacher tries to mix up learners and even out the genders in each group. Pens

Coloured pens, pencils or crayons

Task 2 – Explain that your students are about to watch a video showing some people commentating on a Just Dance tournament. Explain that commentating in esports is called shoutcasting. Tell your students that they should make notes on their task 2 worksheet about what kinds of things the shoutcasters are talking about to give them ideas for what they could talk about in their own commentary.

6 Task 2 – Students should take notes as they watch the video.

7 Task 3 – Explain to your students that another job role in an esports tournament is the host. Tell them that the host is responsible for telling the audience who is about to play and for introducing the tournament.

Tell your students to fill in the table on the left of their worksheet to give them the information they will need to know about the tournament if they were the host and then use this information to write a script that could be used to introduce the tournament on the right. You might like to run this as a competition with the writer of the winning script acting as the host for your tournament.

Show your students the final slide and explain that these 8 are the rules for the tournament.

Prior to running the tournament, ask your students to sign up their team and then randomly arrange the brackets using their team names. There are lots of online bracket generators that will do this for you e.g., https://challonge.com/tournament/bracket generator
